



The International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) starts the Mediterranean Forum in Malaga.

The Forum, which coincides with the 10 Anniversary of the establishment of the IUCN offices for the Mediterranean in Malaga (Spain), will allow IUCN members, individual organisations and other partners to learn from each other and articulate their commitments towards conservation and sustainable development in the Mediterranean.

Around 300 representatives and decision makers from governments, NGOs, the scientific community and the private sector will have the opportunity to meet, strengthen alliances and discuss priorities for the programme of work in the coming years. In particular, issues such as the development of sustainable tourism, energy networks, conservation of species, climate change, management of marine and terrestrial lands and the role of agencies of cooperation and foundations for the Mediterranean Area preservation.

During the opening session the IUCN Med Director signed several memorandum with Spanish and international organisations including the FAO Forest Conservation Service and CopeMed II Project.
